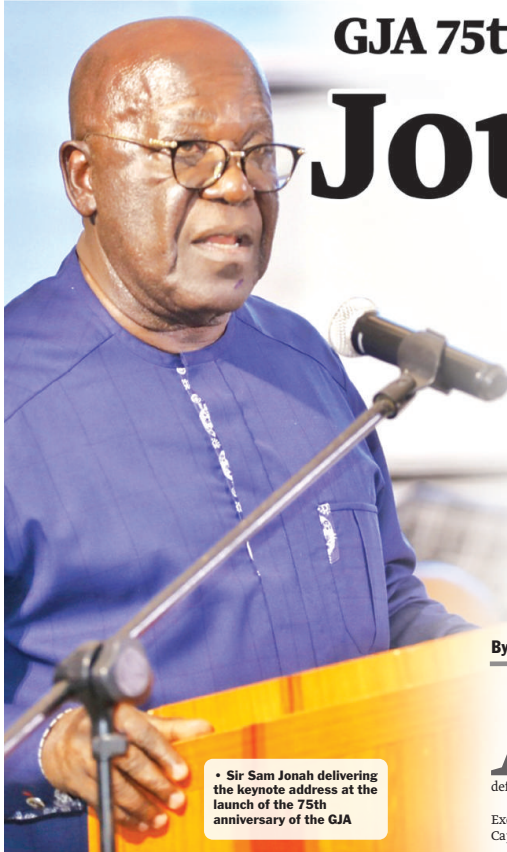


GJA 75th anniversary launch:
