Constitutional Review... Cap ministers at 35

Majority, Minority leaders propose

THE 1992 Constitution has to be amended to place a limit on the number of ministers and justices of the Supreme Court

appointed by the President, the Majority and the Minority leaders in Parliament have advocated.

Speaking at a seminar on constitutional review last Tuesday, the two leaders in Parliament were of the view that the lack of a ceiling for those appointments was unsustainable and a bane to good

and efficient governance.

For the Majority Leader, Osei Kyeei-Mensah-Bonsu, the country needed not more than 35 ministers, including regional ministers, while the number of justices of the Supreme Court
