Jeremy Doku

The speedster

FOR many, Jeremy Doku, representing Belgium at the 2022 World Cup in Qatar may not have come as a surprise as he was among the few players who pledged their allegiance to their country of birth.

Even though the 20-year-old is of Ghanaian descent, he decided to play for the country of his birth, having represented the European side right from Under-15 to Under-21.

Coincidentally, the player who is nicknamed Eden Hazard, was born exactly four days before the start of the 2002 World Cup in Japan and South Korea.

Jeremy, who is known for his sprint speed, acceleration, agility, balance and explosive dribbling style, is the second child and son out of four children to his parents – David and Belinda Doku, who have been beautifully married for years.

Known as Jeremy Baffour Doku, the winger started his playing career at a young age in Antwerp with KVC Olympic Deurne and Tubantia Borgerhout, then he played for Beerschot. Later on, he moved to R.S.C. Anderlecht in 2012 at the age of 10.

His professional debut came at the age of 16 with Anderlecht and at the age of
